

Accelerated Master in Public Health

Starting in Summer 2014, Northwestern University's Program in Public Health will offer a four-quarter, intensive MPH geared toward the needs of health professionals, medical students, and public health workers who wish to complete the MPH degree in one year of intensive, full-time coursework and field experience in Chicago. Northwestern University has long provided an opportunity for health care professionals and those working in public health and medical research the opportunity to pursue a MPH degree through a part-time, evening program on its Chicago campus; the degree typically requires 3-4 years to acquire in this way. The new 1-year option builds on that experience, expanding the Program's availability to those who require or prefer the shorter timeframe.

Applications are being accepted now for Summer Quarter 2014. The deadline for applications is April 15.

Required application materials:

- Statement of Purpose (should include career goals and reasons for pursuing the MPH degree)
- Official Transcripts (from all universities attended)
- GRE Scores (waived for students and graduates of US and Canadian medical schools) and TOFEL Scores (TOFEL for international students only)
- Letters of Recommendation
- Curriculum Vita (desirable but not required, submitted with your Online Application)
